Spiritual Shedding

In recent sermons, Pastor Patrick has emphasized our great need to root ourselves in close, intimate relationship with God to enable us to live the lives we are designed and called to live. While certainly our lives with God ought to include joy and celebration (Christmas/Easter), they also ought to include times of solemnity with penitence (Advent/Lent). This is the rhythm throughout the biblical story - Israel cycles from blessing to self-reliance followed by exile and repentance; feasting and fasting. We prefer feasting over fasting, but we need both. Our sinful tendencies keep us from being able to sustain virtues like love and humility during long periods of prosperity. We become lovers of pleasure, power and convenience and forget love of God and neighbor.

So, as people who desire to abide in God's love, Lent's call to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving is a gift. It's an opportunity to communally recommit ourselves to God through spiritual renewal, self-discipline, and neighbor-love. I'm glad we do this together as a community. It holds me accountable to the self-discipline of Lent. I look forward to how God might shape my heart, mind, and body more into the likeness of Jesus during this season.

Will you join me by choosing some thoughtful practices for Lent, perhaps one in each area: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving? Perhaps you can choose a specific prayer or a pre-determined amount of time to pray daily. For fasting, maybe choose a non-essential food, activity, or convenience that's habitual for you and refrain from it deliberately. And almsgiving can be as simple as putting change in a jar daily with the intent to donate it somewhere at/after Easter (a good practice for kids!).

What matters is doing what you're *able* to do and doing it intentionally and consistently. Noticing how our minds, bodies, and emotions respond to these practices can show us where idols have sneaked in. For instance, crankiness when I fast becomes an opportunity to rely on Jesus in weakness. And rather than judging myself when some less than Christlike tendencies bubble up, I simply acknowledge my weakness and lean more into God for help.

Lent is *not* a season of self-flagellation or punishment for our sins; it's meant to illuminate areas where self-reliance and pride have sneaked in so we can repent. Like the animals that shed their winter coats in spring, Lent offers us the chance to shed our self-sufficiency, self-focus, and self-gratification so we can put on the new and glorious life Jesus has promised.

Minutes for Christian Fellowship Church of Eldora Council/SPRC; February 19, 2025, 4:30 pm

Members present: Dave Dunn, Pastor Susan, Pastor Pat, Scott Swartz, Jim Johnson, Vic Reist, Trista Nelson, Rosanne Foster, Steve Foster, Val Soesbe, Mary Swartz, and Blaire Donaldson. Ann Raisch attended.

Dave Dunn called the meeting to order, and Pastor Patrick began with a devotion.

The minutes were reviewed. Jim Johnson moved to accept last month's minutes; Val Soesbe seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

TRUSTEES –

- The roof has been repaired but it hasn't rained so it is unknown whether all the leaks have been fixed.
- The west door will continue to be locked during Sunday service.

FINANCE – All the bills are up to date. Total input for the year is \$15,280, expenses \$13,164. Vic Reist moved to accept the finance report; Pastor Pat seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS –

- Ash Wednesday Service time was set at 6:00 pm
- March's council meeting will be moved to March 19 at 4:30 pm
- Jim Johnson moved, and Trista seconded to have Tracy Morlan add LED lights in the new sign.
- The Byrtie Allen family suggested using Byrtie and Floyd's memorial fund money to pay for the sign, this was approved.
- Trista Nelson moved, and Val Soesbe seconded to approve of the EMT crew using the south lawn of the church for an Easter egg hunt on Palm Sunday.
- Ann Raisch gave a presentation to plant some trees on the south lawn. She suggested fruit trees, but it was also discussed to add some shade trees and a bench for people to use. It was decided to explore further.
- The Facebook page is up and running
- Security and safety concerns were discussed. Some ideas were to close off the stairs with a door going downstairs from the west door; locking the west door and installing a doorbell was also discussed. No decision was made at this time.
- We would like to plan another church brunch. It was decided to wait until closer to Easter and then inviting the Hubbard congregation.
- The VA Mobile Clinic will be parking north of the Church on: 03/06, 05/06, 07/10, 09/11, and 11/06. The workers will be given access to the church to use the restroom.

OLD BUSINESS –

- The children's church/SS is in the research stage.
- The funeral policy is being worked on.
- The kitchen remodel should be completed next week. The painting is all that needs to be done.
- Greg Salvo would like to lead an outdoor adventure outing


